This event matches the largest instrument in the southern hemisphere with one of the northern hemisphere's most sought-after solo musicians. German organ dynamo Christian Schmitt will present an hour of concert favourites including Johann Sebastian Bach's evergreen Air, the masterful Orpheus by Franz Liszt and organ classics by Mendelssohn and Widor. Christian Schmitt has performed as soloist with the Berlin Philharmonic Orchestra and Vienna Radio Symphony Orchestra. His stunning virtuosity is balanced with glorious subtlety, and he is the perfect choice to showcase the Grand Organ's impressive sonic palette.

Winner of the 20th Grand Prix de Chartres International Organ Competition (France), Dong-ill Shin has been hailed as 'one of the world's most promising talents of his generation'. He also is a prize winner of the Musashino-Tokyo International Organ Competition (Japan), Ciurlionis International Piano and Organ Competition (Lithuania), Prague Spring International Music Festival and Competition (Czech Republic), and the St. Albans International Organ Competition (UK). Dong-ill served as Adjunct Professor of Organ at Texas Wesleyan University. Recently he moved back to his native South Korea to take up the position of Professor of Organ at Yonsei University, Seoul. 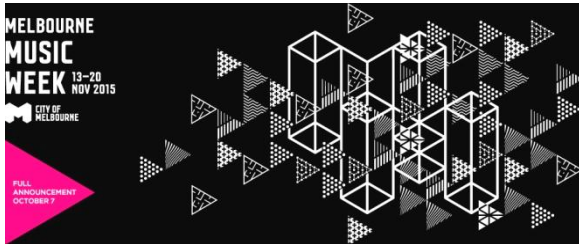

## ORGAN SCHOLAR - CHRIST CHURCH SOUTH YARRA

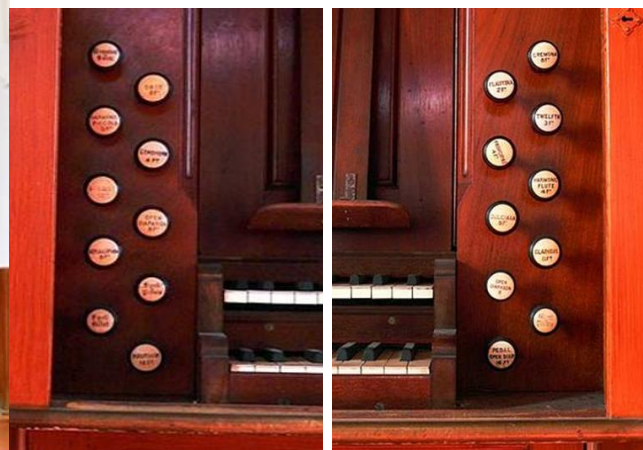

## ORGAN FOR SALE – PRICE NEGOTIABLE (Above)

Organ built in 1884 by Alfred Fuller, Kew, for the Congregational Church, Kew. Casework designed by architect FJ Smart. In 1893 it was installed at its present location in Brighton and the original pedal Violoncello 8 replaced by an Open Diapason 16.

The original pipe stencilling and casework decoration was painted over prior to its rebuilding by Laurie Pipe Organs in 1968. At this time, the original mechanical key and stop action and wind system and the great Flautina 2 were removed. Electro-pneumatic action, a detached stop key console, a new wind system and a new Fifteenth 2 on the great were introduced. However, the whole of the original pipe work remains, apart from the Flautina, and the original console survives behind the case doors, probably locally the most elaborate from this period to survive, with woodwork of French polished mahogany, three rear panels, raised music desk and overall feeling of superlative quality.

Tonally, the instrument is still outstanding and is classified by the National Trust of Australia (Victoria) as a notable instrument and awaits a sympathetic reconstruction of the original action and wind system. Specification:
